Misses Liffey

To celebrate women in Joyce, Darina Gallagher and Sinead Murphy have created Misses Liffey, a performance of Joyce's female characters that live, laugh and love along the banks of Dublin's great river. Anna Livia Plurabelle, the female personification of the River Liffey, brings us on her journey from little cloud (Nuvoletta), through the city and out into Dublin Bay. We hear from the Washerwomen in Finnegans Wake, the Morkan Sisters and Eveline from Dubliners, the siren barmaids, and the seaside girls in Ulysses. Misses Liffey gives us an insight into the female voices within Joyce's writing and a picture of Dublin in full song. Misses Liffey is the latest theatrical creation by Darina Gallagher and Sinead Murphy, best known for their award-winning show, Songs of Joyce, a musical extravaganza with songs drawn from the life and works of James Joyce. It has toured internationally to critical acclaim including to Boston, New York, Budapest, Prague, San Sebastian and Moscow
